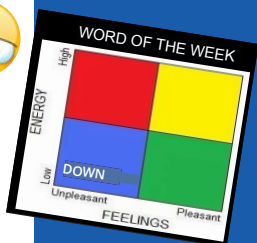
Sounds Like

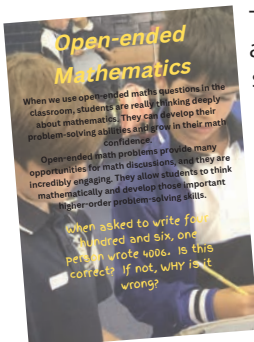
