Class Charters

Over the last couple of weeks I have managed to visit all classrooms to have a chat about their Class Charters.

A class charter is one of the 'core routines' from our RULER strategy. It describes how students want to feel when they are in their classroom and how this can be achieved. Some popular words were Safe, Motivated, Happy, Calm. Ask your kids what their class charter words are over the dinner table tonight!



NAPLAN

NAPLAN begins on Wednesday 15 March for our Year 3 and 5 students. Whilst this is not the only assessment of student achievement at Vasse, it is still an important one.

As a school we use the data to reflect on and improve on our whole school practices and parents get a 'snapshot' of how your child was performing on the day.

It's important that kids experience 'test' conditions and all the feelings that go with it. It might bring about feelings of anxiety or worry and this is normal and sometimes useful for these situations. Some students even love the feeling of accomplishment that comes with doing a test! However you and your child are feeling about NAPLAN, it's important to remember that it's just part of the teaching and learning cycle. All your child needs to do is to try their best!

The Vasse Fathering Project

It was wonderful to hear of all the kids and fathers attending and enjoying the latest 'Planes, Plaits and Percussion' evening at the school.

The overall goals of the group is to get fathers or father figures to spend time with their children and to network and connect with other fathers.

Having strong male role models is important. If your child doesn't have an obvious father figure, see if you can find one by connecting with our local community- try Grandfathers, Uncles, Cousins or Friends. If you are struggling to find a role model please speak to the fathering group about how to build your connections.

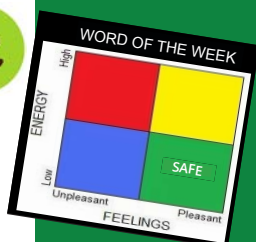

We listened to local Wardandi Elder Bill Webb and friends, tell the history of the local Wardandi Mob, bringing light to the events that happened in the Wonnerup area.

Historian Mary Blight spoke at the 'Truth-Telling' gathering, to share her research findings of the history of the Wardandi people.

The students reflections on the day were-

"We got to listen to other people perspective of happened to the Busselton Indigenous People" - Aliviah

"We don't have the Wardandi version of the story, and what happened." - Izzy

"We went to Buselton and people talked about the Wardandi people and listened to a song called Hope." - Lincoln

"We learnt about the Wardandi people and listened to some songs." - Flynn

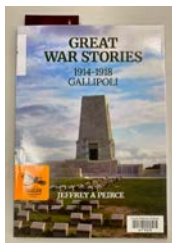

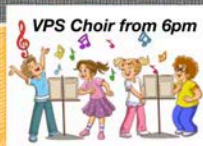
