From the Principal's desk

Staff Development Day

On our Staff Development Day last week, Teachers participated in three rotations to upskill and ensure we are all on the same page with planning and our priorities as a school and Department. The rotations were a presentation by PLD (Promoting Literacy Development), one on the Department's Teaching for Impact strategies and the third was year group planning. Our teachers are incredibly dedicated and inspired and our school is lucky to have such wonderful staff.

Uniforms, Hair and Jewellery at school

Years 1-3 students will be eating lunch first at 12:55 - 1:15 pm and then play until 1:35 pm.

Years 4-6 play first and then eat lunch from 1:15 - 1:35 pm.

The purpose of this trial is to alleviate crowding on the oval for our students, who are incredibly active at break times with most of the school choosing to play on the oval. Change can be tricky for some, so please speak to your child about this. If you have any feedback please let the school know.

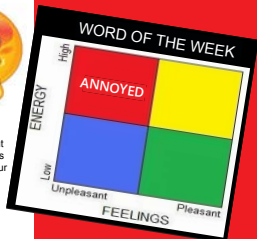

Brows furrow or become drawn together, mouth can be tight and eyes drawn together and focused. Posture is tight.



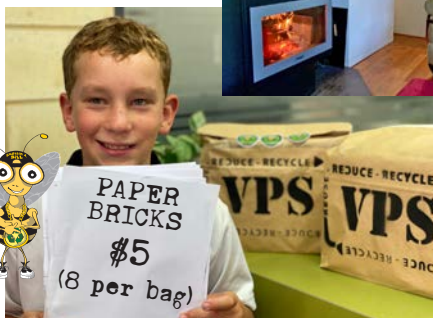
Feels like

Special ANZAC Assembly

On Wednesday 26 April, Vasse Primary School held a special whole school assembly commemorating ANZAC Day (Tuesday 25 April).

Our Student Leaders hosted the assembly, welcoming Special Guest speaker Mr. Jason Ey, and pianist Mrs. Bogachova on this day of Remembrance.

Mr. Jason Ey, local business owner and Busselton community member. Jason is a returned serviceman and has over 10 years working in the Navy as a Clearance Diver and Military Fitness trainer. Mr. Ey spoke to us about his long family military history with both his Grandfather's, Father and Uncle serving in the armed forces. His Grandfather, Reginald "Mick" Ey was one of three Australian Aircrew shot down in 1942 behind enemy lines in the Libyan desert and famously survived and walked to help, some 11 days later.

Jason has raised funds for several Charities such as Legacy, collaboratively running 1100 km across the Nullarbor and also running for 24hrs on the Cape to Cape Track to raise funds for Busselton's Safe Space to recognise his grandfather's feat.


A beautiful fresh wreath was laid at the foot of the Australian Flag pole to symbolise the soldiers who have come to their final resting place. Heads bowed as the bugle sounded "The Last Post" followed by a one minute silence, a pause of respect to those men and women who have given their lives while serving to protect our country.

The Vasse Choir accompanied by Mrs. Bogachova on the piano, led the whole school in the Australian National Anthem plus the choir performed 'Song of Australia' - a beautiful finale to our ANZAC Remembrance Assembly.
