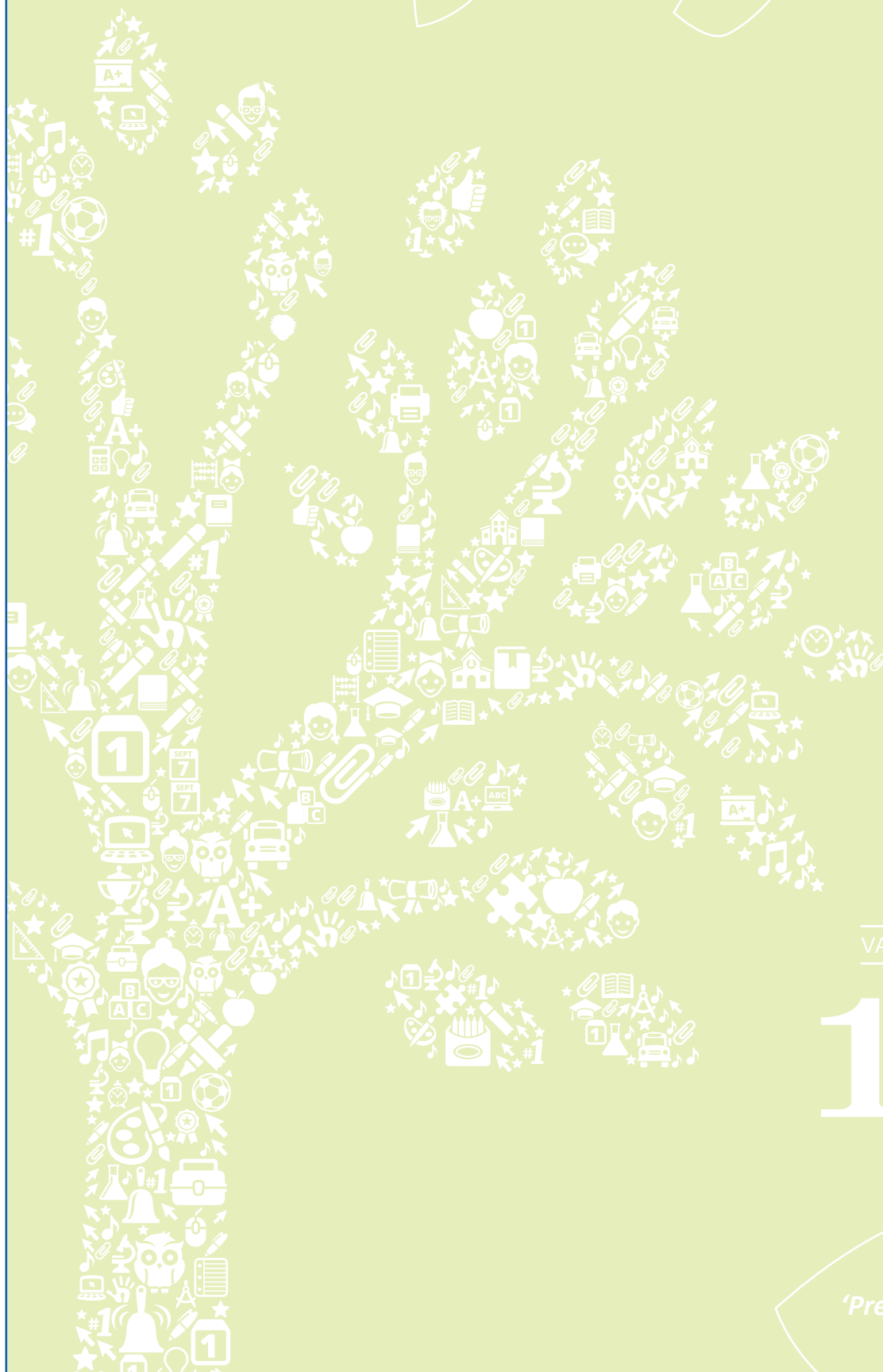

## Our History

The present site of the Vasse Primary School has been in use since 1884, when a stone building was erected as a classroom.

However, schooling began in the area in 1845, at Elijah Dawson's Westbrook property. In the 1850's and 60's, Elijah was aided in this task by American sailors' wives who were based on shore for a year or so at a time, as he was often called away to his duties as police constable.

Research has indicated that we can claim that our school became a public school in 1869.

The federation red weatherboard room (Heritage Room) was built in 1895 and a stone building, now demolished became the teacher's quarters.

In 1904, the school was renamed Newtown.

With numbers in decline, the school was closed from August 1930 until June 1932, and was re-named Vasse in 1938.

The cream weatherboard building adjacent to the Heritage Room was transported from Treeton in 1961.

After the Junior block was built in 1981, the Education Department wished to demolish the 1895 Heritage Room. However, a concerted effort by the community restored the building and saved it for us to admire and use, thus preserving a unique piece of southwest rural history in our school.

The traditional rural setting and modern facilities of this progressive campus promotes education in a collaborative community environment, which will provide learning Programs that will meet the needs of students in the 21st century and respond to a changing society.

This will be achieved through the development of a responsive, inclusive and innovative curriculum, one which consciously seeks to provide for the educational needs of all.

Vasse Primary School became an Independent Public School (IPS) in 2013.





## Assemblies

Our Assemblies are held every Monday during term (except Week 5) and start at 8:50am. Due to the number of students we divide our weekly assemblies into individual Senior or Junior assembly (held in the undercover area) or a whole school combined assembly held either on the bitumen area behind next to the Wicked Patch Kitchen Garden (behind the Heritage Room) or in the Quad. Additionally, Special assemblies are held from time to time to commemorate special events.

Each assembly is hosted by a class and/or student councillors. Class hosting dates are listed in the newsletter and available under 'Calendar' on our website. Parents are welcome and encouraged to attend.

## Attendance

Student attendance at school is crucial to ensure your child has the best chance of learning. Please provide the school with explanations of absence for your children. Your children's records of attendance, along with identification of absences that have and have not been explained, are maintained on the electronic Schools Information System and are checked regularly by the school. An **Absentee notification** can be made to school by phone, through the **Absentee Button** at the top of the homepage on our school website [www.vasseps.wa.edu.au](http://www.vasseps.wa.edu.au), or a written note to the teacher explaining why the student was away.

Under Education Department Regulations, absence from school should only be for illness, or medical and dental appointments. Absences for all other purposes are generally discouraged. Please contact the school if you intend taking your child out of school for any other reason.

If you are collecting your child during school hours, please ensure you firstly come to the Administration office to sign out a Leave Pass for Partial Absence from School.

It is policy that assignments or worksheets are not prepared in advance for children going on holidays, although teachers will indicate areas that will be covered while the child is away.

## Behaviour - PBS- Positive Behaviour Support (School Wide)

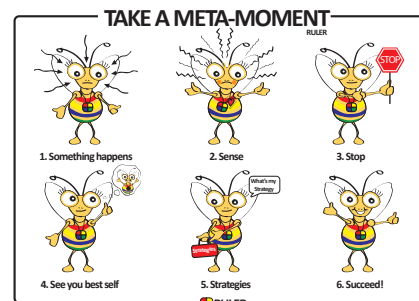
Vasse Primary School began implementing PBS in 2012 with the purpose of establishing, a safe, supportive and positive learning environment.

THREE expectations have been negotiated.

1. Be RESPONSIBLE
2. Be RESPECTFUL
3. Be your BEST

PBS places a major focus on prevention, and the following key elements help to create a safe, positive and productive learning environment:

- We explicitly teach our expectations to provide students with the skills and understandings to reinforce the high standards of the expectations.
- The expectations for all students are clear throughout the school.
- Our expectations specifically address bullying behaviours, provide for a safer school environment and give more time for instruction.
- By detailing expected behaviours and teaching these to students in a positive way, we provide a common language for everyone at Vasse Primary School.
- We give students feedback for displaying the expected behaviour via "Superslips" in the playground, "Dojo" points in class, weekly Merit Certificates and verbal recognition. Parents of students who demonstrate notably positive behaviour receive notification.

In 2019, Vasse Primary School implemented the RULER program, which encourages emotional intelligence through explicitly teaching students to Recognise, Understand, Label, Express and Regulate their emotions appropriately.

We respond to unproductive behaviour through conferencing, reflection sheets (accompanied by reflection time/ time out) re-teach sessions and through our RULER Program using blueprints and teaching meta-moments. Information is recorded on the School Information System (SIS). Parents are contacted, in writing, to notify them of the offences and consequences incurred.

## Canteen

The school canteen operates on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Our canteen offers online ordering through <https://quickcliq.com.au/> Please sign up and follow the instructions to place your order. Online orders close 8:30am on the day.

Manual ordering is also available and must be made before school, should be written on a paper bag and the money securely enclosed. Paper bags are available outside the canteen. The child's name and room number must be clearly marked. Parent volunteers are essential to ensure the canteen continues to operate. We encourage parents to please contact the canteen staff if you would like to be of assistance. The current canteen menu will be available on our website or from the canteen.

The canteen committee is a sub committee of the P&C and welcomes new volunteers, especially if you are interested in having a say in the canteen menu.

## Chaplain Support

School chaplains make a valuable contribution to the social, emotional and spiritual wellbeing of school communities across Western Australia. This might include support and guidance about ethics, values, relationships and helping students engage with the broader community. Our school is fortunate to host a chaplain for three days a week. The chaplain's focus is in non-denominational pastoral care. The chaplain coordinates our Ed Connect School Mentoring Program and Monday's Breakfast Club Program.

## Conflict Resolution

Most school problems can be resolved by making an appointment to discuss them with your child's teacher. Not only is it a courtesy to always make this your first step in resolving a problem, by doing so you will also be complying with the disputes and complaints policy:

### School Level Resolution

#### Stage 1: DISCUSSION WITH STAFF MEMBER.

Contact your class teacher or other relevant staff member to discuss your complaint. This is best done by making an appointment through the school office. The staff will work with you to resolve the problem.

#### Stage 2: REVIEW OR INVESTIGATION AT THE SCHOOL LEVEL.

Contact the Principal who will work with you and the staff member to resolve the problem. You may wish to formalise your complaint. To do this, you may write to the principal who will acknowledge the complaint with a written reply as soon as possible, even if a resolution is not available at this stage. The Principal will consider the issue and identify what action is to be taken and by when, and will clarify the process if a formal complaint is to proceed. The Principal may seek the support of the Manager of District Operations or other relevant district staff.

## Curriculum

Vasse Primary School staff base their delivery of curriculum on the Western Australian Curriculum. They do this through the provision of a wide range of learning experiences developed by the school as Whole School Programs. These Programs cover the following learning areas:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science & Technology
- The Humanities
- PBS (Positive Behaviour Support)
- Specialist Learning - Physical Education, Music, Art, Dance & Drama.

## Dental Van - Mobile School Dental Service

All Primary School children are eligible to attend the mobile Dental Van during the school year. The care includes routine dental examinations or check-ups, oral health advice, extractions, fillings, X-rays and fissure sealants. ## Interm Swimming Classes

All children from Pre Primary - Year 6 are expected to attend Interm swimming lessons. The Years 4-6 will have lessons at the Busselton beach foreshore in Term 1 during Weeks 2 and 3.

In Term 3 students from Pre Primary - Year 3 lessons will be held at the Geographe Leisure Centre (GLC) from Week 6 through to Week 9. Parents will be advised of dates via our newsletter and the school website calendar.

## Lost Property

The LOST PROPERTY TUB is located on the verandah outside Room 7. Unlabelled items will be placed here. Please ask your child to check the lost property tub regularly. All named/labelled clothing will be handed back by Room 7 students.

## Medical Records - Students

Parents/carers may need to complete a *Student Health Care Summary* and/or a *Management/Emergency Response Plan* for your child's particular health need. Please ensure your child's Student Health Care records are kept up to date by informing the front office of any changes.

## Medication at School



Please provide all necessary medication for your child to the front office. This includes asthma puffers, Epipens, Panadol, etc. The medication must be clearly labelled with the child's name and provided in packaging from the pharmacy or the manufacturer. Documentation must be signed and dated by a parent or carer and provided to the school with the medication.

Student Medical/Authorisation to Administer Medication forms are available at the front office and online to download at [www.vasseps.wa.edu/useful-links/downloads/download-category/medical/](http://www.vasseps.wa.edu/useful-links/downloads/download-category/medical/). Except in an extreme emergency, (e.g. unexpected anaphylaxis), medication can only be administered by school staff if appropriate documentation has been completed by parents/carers. This applies to both prescribed and non-prescribed medication.

## Messages for students

Phone messages from parent/guardian to students need to be called through to the school no later than 2:30pm to guarantee message delivery to the classroom.

## Mobile Phones

Students are not permitted to use mobile phones at school. If they need to bring them to school they are either to be handed over to the teacher or at the Administration office. Parents should be aware of the possibility of cyber bullying and keep appropriate track of their child's phone use.

## Music Tuition

Year 5 students have the opportunity to be selected for our Specialist Music Program. Please see our Music Specialist for more information.

## Newsletter

Our fortnightly newsletter is published on Friday of Week 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9 of each term. This informative newsletter contains photos and articles of the school's activities. The eNewsletter is distributed through email and the school's website. Please ensure we have your correct email address. A hard copy is available for review on the three notice boards around school and at the front office

## Parent help and volunteers

The school benefits enormously from having parents involved in various ways. Parents can build relationships with the staff and gain insight into the operation of the school, and students really enjoy having their parents take an interest in their activities. Our staff greatly appreciate the support of parents and communicating with them on a personal level.

Each year parents help us in many different ways, including volunteering to assist at classroom level, covering books, helping at busy bees, and preparing food at the canteen. Parents attending any overnight camps will need a working with children's check.



## Parents and Citizens

This parent organisation provides a vital link between parents and the school. Meetings are held monthly and dates are noted in the school newsletter and VPS Website under Calendar .

The P & C serves two main functions:

- It is a forum to allow parents to be involved in discussing issues important to the school
- It is a major source of funding for school facilities not covered by the Education Department

Parents have the opportunity to keep in touch with and influence what is happening in the school by having an input into the monthly meetings at which all parents are welcome.

Parents with children in the school for the first time are most welcome at P & C meetings, and they are encouraged to take the opportunity to join when their child starts at Vasse Primary School. It is a great way to meet other parents and to find out what is happening at school.

## Parking and Student Drop off / Pick up

The kiss and drop zone is an excellent location to drop off and pick students up from school. Please be aware that rangers do patrol the area frequently and will issue infringements for illegal parking. The Vasse Hall and tennis club carpark are also convenient locations for parking.

The staff car park is for school employees only. You may use the staff car park if you have an interview with a member of the Vasse staff. It is a safety issue if these car parks are used for students being delivered or picked up from school.



## Personal Items List

To assist your child to do his/her best, parents are requested to ensure that children have all items listed on our Personal Items list for your child's specific year group. Copies are available for download online via the school website or from the Administration office. Our supplies list specify certain items which have been selected by teachers to assist in your child's education.

Please assist by purchasing the specified items, to allow uniformity of instruction. If your child doesn't have an essential item of equipment, it's a disadvantage to learning. Please provide your child with all the tools for a successful year in 2020.

## School Board

Our school annually forms a School Board, the members of which are drawn from parents of students at the school, members of the general community, and staff of the school. The board is formally accountable to the Minister of Education, and its functions include:

- Review and endorse the School Business Plan
- Ratifying financial arrangements necessary to fund the business plan
- Evaluating the school's performance in achieving targets set in the Business Plan
- Approval of a code of conduct i.e. discipline policy
- Determining a dress code for the school
- Marketing
- Approve fees and charges
- Determining sponsorship and advertising

The board is strictly focused on strategic functioning of the school not the daily operational functions.

## School Buses

Please be sure to let us know if your child is to catch the bus to and from school. If there will be any changes to your child's routine – i.e. If you choose to pick up your child on a particular day, please let your child's Teacher or the Front Office know in writing.

In the afternoons, all bus children are taken from the classroom to the bus area by the teacher assistant.

## Uniform Policy

At Vasse Primary School we are very proud of our school and its heritage. Students are expected to take pride in their appearance. The quality of their work is directly related to a sense of belonging. School uniforms help to establish the sense of personal pride we are seeking and are easy for parents to manage on a day to day basis.

Vasse Primary School has created a dress code that we believe is fair and in the best interests of all. The code is in line with the Department of Education's recommendations and follows clear guidelines.

This Uniform Policy is endorsed by the School Board as a school policy. Copies can be downloaded from the school website. We would appreciate your support in the application of this policy as we feel it is important to school morale and pride.

### Our Uniform consists of;

- School logo Black bucket hat.
- School logo Black/White polo shirt.
- School uniform black micromesh shorts.
- School logo Zip Jacket.
- School logo black track pants (blue/white piping).
- School logo faction shirts (Green, Red, Blue, Gold).
- School uniform black Zina skirt.
- Plain black tights/stockings (no coloured stitching, motifs or additions).
- School uniform dress (blue chequered).



### Footwear

- Black shoes are recommended as part of the main uniform.
- White "sneakers" are recommended for sport.
- Sandals are acceptable.



### Hat Policy

The school has a responsibility to encourage the safe use of headwear and the hat policy will be in place during the months that contain an "r" (i.e. February).

It is now compulsory for all students to wear a hat when playing on the oval during recess and lunch. Students without a hat are required to play under cover or shade of a man made structure within play areas.

Students are not required to wear a hat during the months that don't contain an "r".

### Special Events

There are several issues related to the wearing of uniforms in special circumstances.

For interschool sport and for faction carnivals students need to wear school or faction colours, as appropriate. There may be different footwear requirements for various activities and appropriate directions will be given.

For public level presentations (e.g. Choir) children may have the privilege of participating but will need to wear school uniform.

Attendance to school excursions requires uniforms to be worn to allow for easy identification of students.

### Sanctions

Students not following the dress code will receive:

- A note to parents advising of inappropriate dress;
- Counselling from a designated staff member on the benefits of a dress code;
- Assistance/support in obtaining suitable clothing, if necessary; and a pass for an agreed length of time for dress modification.

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Students who still do not comply with the school's dress code will be denied the opportunity to represent their school at:

- Official school activities;
- Choir performances;
- Interschool sports competitions;
- Class excursions.

### Other Matters

- Hair below shoulder length will need to be tied back.
- Make-up is not accepted at school.
- Jewellery - Earrings studs and sleepers acceptable. Bangles are NOT acceptable for safety reasons.
- Watches and "medic alert" bracelets are acceptable.

Whilst the school will actively encourage all aspects of school uniform, it will respect cultural and religious exemptions. The school will implement strategies to acknowledge and promote individual and whole class wearing of uniforms.

Families suffering financial difficulty in supporting the dress code may approach the Principal or P & C President privately and in confidence. The Uniform Policy on school dress may be reviewed if the need arises.

### Voluntary Contributions and Charges

Financial support from parents plays an important role in providing resources that extend learning opportunities and experiences for all students attending Vasse Primary School. The continuing partnership between parents and schools is vital, ensuring that all students receive a level of education which enables them to succeed in today's society. It is crucial to our school that we maintain this high level of support for our school.

Vasse Primary School Board has endorsed the schedule of Contributions and Charges which can be downloaded from our school website.

Vasse Primary School offers other services that incur costs but are not directly related to the schools core business such as uniforms, school photos, book club, and charitable collections (free dress days etc). These costs have not been added to our schedule.

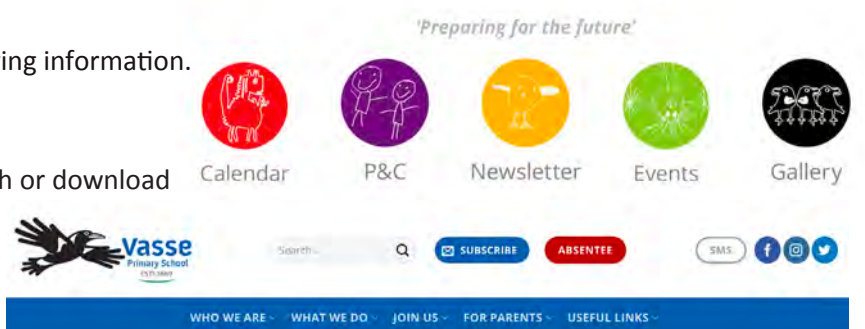

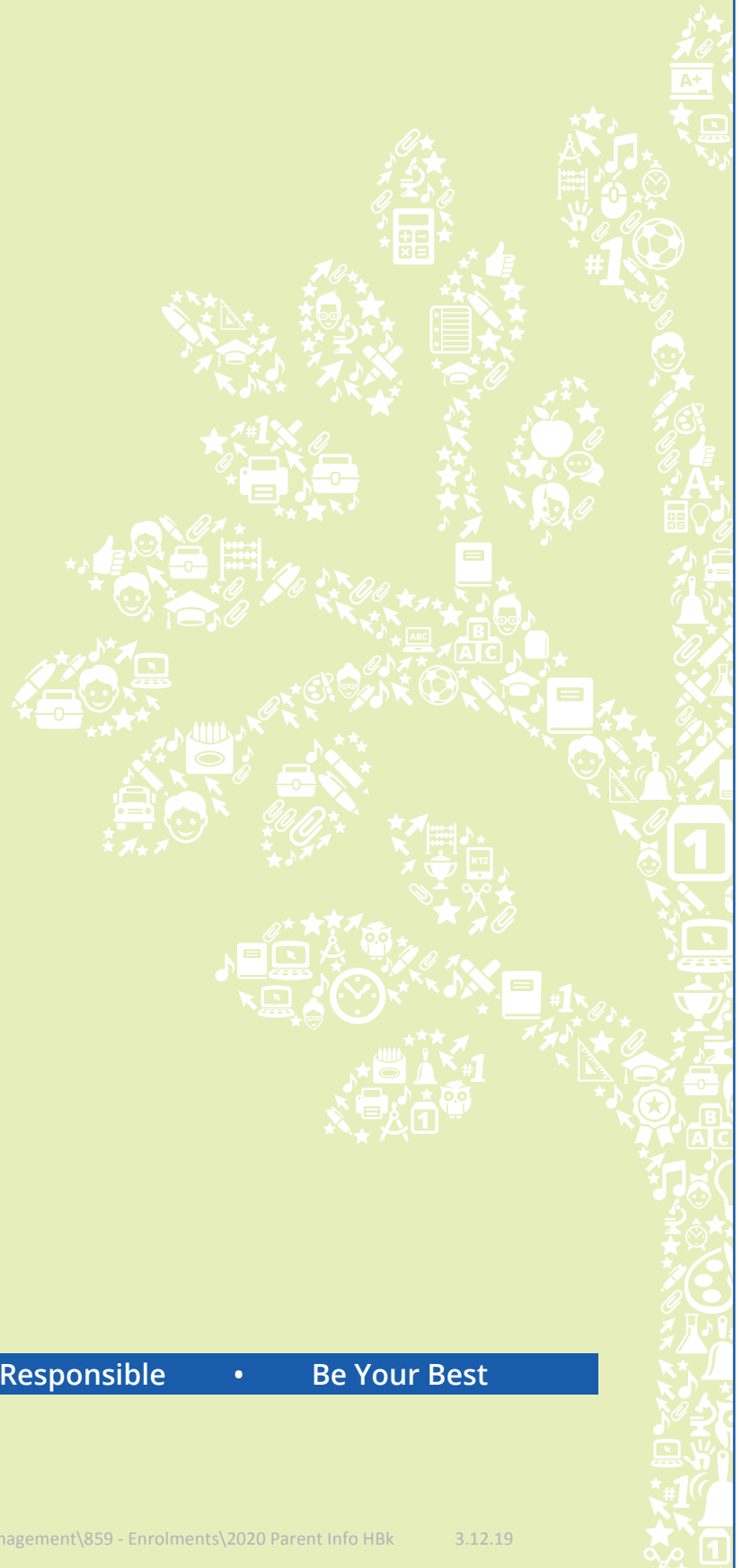
