


# Vasse Primary School Annual Report 2020

'Preparing for the future'



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## **Executive Summary**

Vasse Primary School has a long and historic past. It is through the professionalism, devotion and enthusiasm of all staff that Vasse PS continues to provide a quality, challenging educational program for students in their care. The good standing of this school across the State is a credit to the whole school community; staff, students and parents, and something for all to be proud of.

Although the population of Vasse Primary School has increased, the school maintains a rural feel, helped by its location and the number of trees and grassed areas. Vasse Primary School actively promotes its PBS behavioural expectations of Be Responsible, Be Respectful and Be Your Best. Everywhere in the school, the school expectations are displayed to ensure all members of the school community are aware of these expected behaviours.

We note and value the community feedback which we frequently receive regarding the positive and friendly atmosphere which pervades the school.

2020 will go down in history as one of the most disruptive years in recent history. The worldwide pandemic of COVID-19 caused schools to recreate the way they operate and had everyone referring to the media daily.

In a three-week period, education in Western Australia was turned on its head. Students were being taught online from home with teachers quickly learning the art of Zooming. Work packs were developed and suddenly schools became very quiet buildings.

Thankfully Western Australia was able to manage the pandemic and schools were able to return to some form of normality albeit in a state which had closed the doors to the rest of the world, literally. Anxiety was at an all-time high, which led to the consistent message coming from the leadership team "To lead with care and compassion and not necessarily curriculum." The National Education Authorities canceled NAPLAN across Australia along with many other educational programs, conferences and professional development.

COVID-19 however did provide us with a silver lining, in that it allowed us to think about what was really important. It defined what we wanted to keep (ie hand sanitiser in all classrooms), and what we could let go, due to the disruption of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The school entered its third and final year of the business plan with many of the strategies implemented. Staff have embraced the strategies in each of the operational plans with pleasing results and high levels of engagement.

Throughout this report you will find information relevant to School Context, Performance and Management in 2020. The information provided is a snapshot of many of the activities, events and organisational structures within the school and I hope you find its contents informative.

Additional information is always available through the School Board, Vasse PS P&C and School Administration.






#### **Attendance - Students & Staff**

#### **ACER Assessment 2020**

Vasse Primary utilises ACER assessments in the areas of Math and English to monitor student's achievements in these areas. Assessments are performed in Term 1 and Term 4 by the students online.

The data in Term 1 is analysed by teachers in their year groups where they isolate areas of weakness and also identifying target students who have the potential to make positive gains. Year level targets are then also set. These targets and the students are monitored throughout the year.

The assessments are delivered again in Term 4 and the data is scrutinised. Teachers look at the Year level target and the target students. The four diagrams show the median scores in Term 1 and then in Term 4.

In 2020 every Year level demonstrated positive growth and above, or close to the National Median score.


# **Parent Satisfaction Survey 2020**

We received 150 responses to the survey which is a pretty good response. Year 2 response was the highest, followed by Year 4 with a relative even spread for the others.

#### Parent Feedback

We received a relative positive response from parents in regards to aspects of the school. An average of 4.4/5 was scored across all questions.

The highest scoring response was; 4.7 This school is well led.


The lowest scoring was:

- 4.1 The teachers at this school provide my child with useful feedback
- 4.1 The school takes parents opinions seriously
- 4.1 My child's learning needs are being met at this school.
- 4.1 The school works with me to support my child's learning.

#### **Analysis**

It is clear that communication between the school and individual parents needs to be strengthened. This could mean three-way conferences with the student, teacher and parents or just teacher, parents formalised meetings. This is to be discussed with staff, school board and parent bodies.

Parents prefer Class Dojo followed by emails as the best means of communicating, the school will strengthen communicating with parents in these formats.





#### Parent Comments from the survey;

#### What are some of the positive aspects of Vasse Primary School? (111 responded)

Friendly atmosphere, good connections and relationships between children, staff and families. Child led play based learning and opportunities for each child to grow and reach their potential at his or her own, unique rate and way.

Great school! Great communication and community feel. Positive teacher and kids. I Love the emotional development it really comes through in the boys social interaction. Great out of the box teaching approaches, teaching for the unknown future out kids will be walking into.

I like the Kathy Walker approach to early learning and how it carries on through to the older years with inquiry etc. I like the Ruler emotional awareness program they use and how mindfulness is an everyday part of school life.walk and talk is great. Kitchen garden is great. Teachers seem to enjoy their job and are passionate about the school values. Seems to be a very holistic school.

The Chaplain; so caring and skilled at what she does. Inclusive; Indigenous programs, students with disabilities, students from trauma backgrounds. Teachers; competent, caring, innovative, approachable, positive, cheerful Admin team; inspire confidence in their ability to run and coordinate the school, respectful to adults and students Office staff; know their work, kind and thoughtful, a joy

The school provides opportunities for all students, regardless of their strengths. Arts and sports are encouraged along with academics. Communication is good. Staff are always looking for different ways to engage students with learning.

# What are some of the aspects that Vasse Primary School could improve on? (92 responded)

Numeracy and literacy. Teaching the kids to have pride in neatness and presentation. Creating opportunities for kids to be challenged if they are working above the average.

Support for children with extra needs Parking on the junior side of the school

Teacher quality and current evidence based practices. Teacher communication in PP this year has been poor with little effort to interact with parents or see parents as partners in the education process. A consistent approach across year levels for communication. Each class teacher seems to have different standards of what is communicated and parent involvement.

The size of the school is growing to large and losing some of its appeal. The facilities need to be upgraded like the undercover area and toilets.

More informal feedback on children's progress between reports. There is less time at the classroom door than previously so this does not occur as spontaneously as it once did.

Communication strategy: information overload! Relevant comms are easily missed by busy parents. Eg The fathering project comms - less relevant email updates desensitised my hubby who then missed the email to book the event. Of the messaging re Mr K sausage sizzle it was only the initial note that mentioned the requirement for parents to sign something. Etc

I know Covid has meant changes, but I feel my child is missing out by not allowing parents into the classrooms of kindy and pre-primary in the morning to see what they are up to. It builds strong bonds between kids and the other parents - it's how you get to know the year group. It is great that kids have become more independent but it would be nice to come into the class if we are able to.

There were 15 comments all related to parking.





#### What aspects should the school focus on over the next 3 years? (84 responded)

This is difficult to answer, but continuing community programs such as the Fathering project would be one area to focus on, as this is a wonderful initiative for the men in our community. It so positively encourages Dad's to be more involved with the school community and provides a great network for the Dad's

Investment in sets of reading books for PP-3. Some are outdated and are not ideal first readers. More emphasis on phonics would be beneficial.

Connection to country, climate change, religious awareness ( we are atheists but feel an understanding of other religions is a valuable learning and tolerance tool, plus the basics maths, English and science

Continue focusing on development of the whole child ie academic, emotional, social, physical

Infrastructure to cater for growing school, such as extending The Hive. I think it is feasible student numbers will reach 1000 kids. Continue to support The Fathering Project and Pastoral Care.

Innovate to support teachers in executing their plans.

Learning about regenerative agriculture and eating whole foods, while reducing food rewards based around sugar etc. Focusing on teaching the kids critical thinking skills. Identifying kids that may come from homes where they aren't learning basic life skills and then adding in an extra program where they can learn basics - preparing food, basic hygiene, belonging to sports communities etc.

Providing explicit education into equal opportunities for boys and girls (female rights) and big discussions into acceptance of people from all backgrounds. Vasse is not very multicultural or diverse so I think explicit education is required. More explicit education into climate change, global warming, renewable energy etc from a global point of view.

Teacher-parent communication...What is happening in the classroom termly or focus learning so parents can support this at home. Literacy practices that are aligned with current research

Slowing the growth in overall student numbers. Assessing the measurable outcomes of investigative learning and communicating those results in a transparent fashion to parents.





## **Locally Generated Revenue - Budget vs Actual**






