

E-Rideables at School

E-Scooters use in our community for transportation in increasing. In accordance with the current laws, E-Rideables (scooter/skateboard) with a power output of 200 watts or above can only be ridden by a person 16 years+; the rider must wear a helmet and only permitted to travel at 10kmph on a public footpath and 25kmph on a shared path.

If a student is riding an illegal E-Rideable (200 watts+) the E-Rideable will need to be picked up by a Parent.

E-Rideables (less than 200watts) ridden to school will be stored in the bike racks on arrival and charging facilities will **not** be available. For further information Tap or Scan QR above.
